COVID-19 VACCINES




PROTECTION

Getting COVID-19 vaccines will protect you from getting very sick from COVID-19.




SAFETY

COVID-19 vaccines followed the same safety steps as all other vaccines and continue to be monitored for safety.



EFFECTIVENESS

COVID-19 vaccines that are available in the U.S. are highly effective.



INGREDIENTS

COVID-19 vaccines do not contain any live virus, so they cannot make you sick or change your DNA.



SIDE EFFECTS

It is normal to feel mild or moderate symptoms, like fever or fatigue, after a vaccine. This means your immune system is working! Allergic reactions are very rare.



TOOLS

Vaccines are one layer of protection. Masks, social distancing, and good hygiene are necessary tools to prevent illness.

YOUR COVID-19 VACCINE QUESTIONS ANSWERED

1

WHO SHOULD GET THE VACCINE?

Everyone 16 or older should get a COVID-19 vaccine unless your doctor recommends otherwise. Talk to your doctor if you have severe allergies, or are pregnant or breastfeeding.

2

WHEN AND WHERE CAN I GET VACCINATED?

Because vaccine supply is currently limited, Oregon is using a phased distribution plan that prioritizes healthcare workers, educators, and vulnerable populations. Visit covidvaccine.oregon.gov for updates on your eligibility and locations.

WHAT DOES IT COST?

COVID-19 vaccines are free to everyone, regardless of insurance status. You will not pay to be vaccinated.

I HAD COVID-19. DO I NEED A VACCINE?

Yes. Reinfection with COVID-19 is possible, and it is unknown how long you are protected from getting sick again after recovery.

5

IF I'M VACCINATED, CAN I STILL SPREAD COVID-19?

We do not know. Vaccines are effective at preventing COVID-19 disease, but we do not know yet if a vaccinated person is less likely to spread the virus to someone else. This is why you must continue to mask, social distance, and wash hands.
